

- 1. Volcanic.
- Al. Fine grained Porphry, either intensive or extensive.
- A2. Aplite, appears to be a light colored granite rock, either a small dyke or margin of a larger body.
- A.5 Appears to be a contact rock such as one finds on a granite contact and may be either sedimentary or igneous.
- G. Appears to be a volcanic.
- 3. Indeterminate. Looks like A2.
- 4. Looks like a baked argillaceous rock from near a granite contact.
- 5. Appears to be a volcanic.
- C. Indeterminate. Looks as if it might be a contact phase of Al.
- 6. Indeterminate, suggests volcanic origin.
