DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The underlying rocks are mainly quartz diorite of the Cretaceous (?) Nelson intrusions, but include remnants of greenstone of the Permian and/or Triassic Anarchist group. Four veins, with general east-west strikes and vertical dips, have been discovered. A quartz vein about 6 inches wide on the Lucky Boy claim contains mineralization in veinlets and segregations, mainly on the hanging wall. The remainder of the vein is barren quartz. The mineralization includes pyrite, galena, sphalerite, and chalcopyrite. A sample from a pile of sorted ore assayed: gold, trace; silver, 141 ounces per ton; copper, 5.3%.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located at elevations of about 2,800 to 4,000 feet on the west side of the West Kettle River, 2 miles northwest of Beaverdell.

The Lucky Boy property in 1925 consisted of 4 claims, the Lucky Boy, Tie, Ideal, and Glory, owned by Emile Etchepare and associates. The workings at that time included trenches, shallow shafts, and short adits. The 4 claims (Lots 3071 S, 3073 S-3075 S) were Crown-granted in 1930 to Emile Etchepare and Martin Doyharcabol. The Lucky Boy Fraction (Lot 3076 S) was Crown-granted in 1934 to Mr. Etchepare and Associates.
