DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The host rock is Cambrian rusty phyllite of the Horse-thief Creek group. The main showing is a quartz vein about 2 feet wide containing galena. A second vein 8 inches wide outcrops 8 feet below this vein. About 1,000 feet downstream another 8 inch wide vein of massive galena is exposed in the creek bed. The 1981 drilling and sampling gave silver values ranging from 2.4 to 6.4 oz/t; tungsten assayed 0.68% across 0.6 metres; tin was found in all vein intersections with assays of 0.28% over 1.2 metres, 0.25% over 0.4 metres, and 0.22% over 1 metre (Northern Miner, 14/01/82).

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT  
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located at about 6,000' elevation on Spring Creek, a tributary of Crawford Creek, some 32 miles west of Kimberley.

Early work on the showings, reportedly in the 1890's, was done in a short adit. Further prospecting on the showings was done in 1926 by J.W. Mulholland on behalf of Portland interests.

The showings were held as the Barefoot 1 and 2 claims by C. Derbyshire, of Crawford Bay and associates, and acquired by Rose Pass Mines Ltd. in about 1967. Work by the company in the period 1968-72 included bulldozer trenching and more than 1,300' of diamond drilling in 8 or more holes. The company name (Rose Pass) was changed in 1974 to Range Industries Ltd; the property at that time had been reduced to 22 claims.

Springpoint Resources Ltd, in 1980 acquired the Jackass group of 12 recorded claims covering the showings; an additional 24 claims (Barefoot group) was staked adjacent. Work in 1981 included 367 metres of diamond drilling in 6 holes.
