DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The country rocks are banded argillites and quartzites of the Slocan group that form a narrow belt flanked by porphyritic granites of the Nelson batholith. The sediments are metamorphosed and silicified. They strike about N55°E and dip steeply, more commonly southeast than northwest. The attitude of the vein corresponds nearly with that of the enclosing sediments. The lode is from 5 to 25 feet wide and consists of fragments of wall rock and gouge cemented with calcite and a little quartz. It contains irregular small shoots of argentiferous galena and sphalerite, with some pyrite and native silver.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

British Columbia

The mine is located to the east of Myawats creek, a northerly flowing tributary of Keen creek. It may be reached by a two mile tractor road that leaves the Keen creek road at a point about 14 miles from Kaslo.

This property, consisting of the B.N.A., Onoka, Humming Bird, and Lynx Frac. claims, was Crown-granted to the B.N.A. Mines Co. Ltd. in 1904. It was worked intermittently on a small scale until 1911 and then lay idle until 1950.

In 1950 B.N.A. Mines Limited Liability held the property and did a small amount of surface stripping above No. 6 adit. In 1951 a raise was driven in No. 6, or lowest adit, at a point 200 feet from the portal.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION/HISTORIQUE DE LA PRODUCTION

From 1900 to 1952, 99 tons of ore were shipped from the B.N.A. claim. From this ore 3 ounces of gold, 13,032 ounces of silver, 18,587 pounds of lead, and 21,533 pounds of zinc were recovered.

In 1938-39, 68 tons of ore were shipped from the Humming Bird claim. From this ore 3 ounces of gold, 1,835 ounces of silver, 5,951 pounds of lead, and 1,955 pounds of zinc were recovered.
