DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

In the upper adit a mineralized lode from a fraction of an inch to 24 inches in width, can be traced from the portal for a distance of 90 feet. The lode is in sediments of the Slocan series, and mineralization is predominantly sphalerite and galena.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT  
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

Most of the underground workings on this claim were driven prior to 1900, and in 1899 the first and largest shipments of ore were made.

Two adits have been driven at elevations of 5,000 and 5,180 feet. The upper adit is 245 feet in length and contains about 50 feet of crosscuts. At a point 65 feet from the portal a raise has been put up to the surface and in addition there are 2 small stopes, and a winze of unknown depth at 85 feet from the portal. The lower adit is about 175 feet long, with the face located approximately under the winze in the upper adit. At 50 feet from the portal there is a 130-foot drift. No mineralization of value is reported from this adit.

In January 1951 Slocan Lode Mines Limited was formed to develop the claim. In 1952 the workings were rehabilitated, and a stope prepared near the portal. Little work was done in 1953 and there is no record of subsequent development.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION/HISTORIQUE DE LA PRODUCTION

In 1899, 560 tons of ore averaging 70% lead, and 90 ounces of silver per ton was shipped.

Total shipments from the property to the end of 1953 amounted to 585 tons from which 52,245 ounces of silver, 812,683 pounds of lead, and 460 pounds of zinc were recovered. The last recorded ore shipment was in 1953 and consisted of 2 tons of ore sorted from the dumps.
