DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The country rocks are argillites, limestones and quartzites of the Slocan series. These are considerably folded and faulted. The main structural feature on the claim itself is a large drag-fold about 200 feet long. Erratic patches of mineralization occur in fractures in the steep limb of the dragfold. No description has been given of the nature of the mineralization but in this locality it would probably consist of lead, silver and zinc ores.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The claim is located on the east side of Alamo basin which is near the headwaters of Howson creek. It was Crown-granted to W.B. Cash and J.G. Steel in 1897. Leasers did some work on the claim in 1903. The workings consist of 3 very short adits and several open cuts.

In 1952 the claim was owned by Mrs. P.M. Stuart of Seattle.
