DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The underlying rocks are Triassic slate and argillite of the Slokan Series, intruded by quartz-porphyry dykes. The workings explored a northeast striking vein that varies from a few inches to several feet in width. An oreshoot about 60' long with a southwest rake was stoped to surface. Vein filling consisted of quartz, brecciated slates, pyrite, galena, and sphalerite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located at approximately 5,500' elevation on the west side of Mount Payne, 1¼ miles north of Sandon.

The Majestic (Lot 1405) and Unexpected (Lot 2231) claims were Crown-granted to F.H. Bourne and C. French in 1899. Lessees work the property during the 1904-07 period and again in 1910. The owners did some work in 1912 and 1916. Small shipments of ore were reported in most of the above years and again in 1922. Development work to date included 3 adits, the lowest (No. 3) consisting of about 600' of drifting. The vein above No. 3 was locally stoped through No. 2 and No. 1 levels to the surface. In 1929 H.A. Turner optioned the property from Bourne & French for Coast interests. The No. 4 adit was begun and driven to 250' at last report.

Hallmac Mines Limited, owner of the adjacent Altoona property (82 F/14, AG 78) in 1980 acquired a 3 year lease on the Majestic and Unexpected from A.R. Bourne. The company name (Hallmac) was changed in February 1986 to Royal Oak Resources Ltd.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION/HISTORIQUE DE LA PRODUCTION

During the period 1904-22 a total of 241 tons of ore were shipped from this property. From this ore 14,546 ounces of silver and 328,141 pounds of lead were recovered.
