This property is located on the west side of the Columbia River near Casino Creek, about 5 miles southeast of Trail. In 1951 the Casino Red Cap claim was owned by T.P. Voiken & Associates of Trail. The showing was developed by an open cut 8 feet long and 6 feet deep. A crosscut adit, collared 40 feet below the outcrop, was being driven towards the vein. Nothing more was done with the property until 1957 when Messrs. Wells & Donelly began development work on a part-time basis. Two drifts 200 feet long and 25 feet apart in elevation were driven on the near vertical vein. A stope 150 feet long and 6 feet wide was mined between the levels. A small amount of crosscutting was done on the lower level. In 1961 the W.D. Mining Co. Ltd., consisting of 5 men with equal shares, operated the mine on a part-time basis. During the year 355 feet of diamond drilling was completed. Casino Gold Mines Ltd. held an option on the property from June to September 1962. A geological survey was made and some development work done on No. 1 level; diamond drilling in 5 holes was done from No. 1 level. The property was then bought by Messrs. Donelly, Pompu & Ernewin and in October stoping was begun above No. 1 level. During the first half of 1963 about 100 feet of crosscut and 75 feet of raise was completed; stoping was done on No. 1 vein between No. 1 & No. 3 levels.
DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT The formation consists of volcanics of the Rossland formation cut by quartz-diorite of the Nelson batholith, and later granitic intrusions. The showing is situated on the east end and on the south side of a westerly trending intrusion of monzonite which lies between the Nelson plutonic and Ross- land volcanic rocks. The gold occurs in a series of narrow quartz veins which occur along the north-dipping contact of the monzonite with tuffs on the south. The veins have a general northeast strike and dip steeply to the northwest; vein width averages about 14 inches. Minor mineralization of galena, sphalerite, pyrite, and arsenopyrite occurs with the quartz. Where arsenopyrite occurs, gold assays up to 3 ounces per ton were obtained.
