DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

Lenticular masses of serpentinite form part of a linear belt extending 10 km southwest from Rossland. At the Sophia Creek showing three shallow pits expose fine-grained serpentinite with many fractures. Chromite associated with these fractures is fairly abundant in one pit. Two samples of selected material from the pit assayed 3.24 and 12.00% chromium and 0.10 and 0.20% nickel.

Samples from another trench near the northern edge of the same mass of serpentinite (in the vicinity of the Crowngrants?) assayed 0.23% chromium and 0.17% nickel.

The property is underlain by Jurassic Rossland Formation volcanics and serpentized ultramafics. Minor pyrite and pyrrhotite occur in the vicinity of an old shaft on Ross 2 claim.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The area of interest is in the vicinity of Ivanhoe Ridge and Sophia Creek, some 4 miles southwest of Rossland.

From incomplete information it appears that two chromite showings have been prospected, one located on Crown-grants at about 4,400' elevation on Ivanhoe Ridge, and the other, about 1 mile to the south, at about 4,100' elevation on the ridge between the two main forks of Sophia Creek and about 300 metres southeast of the natural gas pipeline.

Crown-grants were obtained on two claims, the Burlington West (Lot 2715) and Burlington (Lot 4359); the latter was Crown-granted to Bob Lamont in 1901.

The reverted Crown-grants were leased and additional claims staked in 1918 by A. Cameron, J.H. MacDonald and associates. Work was apparently confined to trenching and stripping. The Vandot group of 5 recorded claims, reported to be located on the Cascade highway at the first summit west of Rossland, were owned in 1966 by V.M. Van, of Rossland. Old trenches were deepened and sampled.

Noranda Exploration Company Limited held the property in 1984 as the Ross, Ross 2-3, and Cal claims. Work included magnetometer surveys over 15.7 km, induced polarization and electomagnetic surveys over 1.35 km, a geochemical soil survey comprising 177 samples, and trenching.
