"Beryl was found in large blue-green crystals, with garnet, magnetite, and black tourmaline in pegmatite dykes, which are reported by Rice to be abundant in that vicinity. The particular beryl locality is just south of Midge Creek about a mile from Kootenay Lake (Rice, personal communication)." (Mulligan, 1968).
