DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Chalcopyrite, pyrrhotite and arsenopyrite, with values of gold and silver are found in irregular quartz veins in fractured diorite dykes. These dykes cut the flat-lying quartzites of the Aldridge Formation. There is also some iron-capping on this property.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The Blue Peter property is on Alki Creek, 4 miles northeast of Meachen. It was staked in 1898 and owned by Lieut. Colonel Pollen in 1918. Between 1898 and 1920, the workings consisted of two adits, two shafts, one pit and two tunnels. The lower tunnel was 25 feet long, at an elevation of 5,450 feet. The upper tunnel was 100 feet long, at an elevation of 5,525 feet. There was also some surface exploration during this period.

Assays from the dump were 2% Cu and traces of gold and silver.

Selected assays ran 6 oz. Ag/ton; \$3.00 Au/ton and 14% Cu.
