In 1902 apparently optioned by Metropolitan Gold and Silver Mining Company of Lardeau, B.C., Limited. The mine operated intermittently until sometime in 1905.		
OWNER OR OPERATOR AND ADDRESS	Five claims, the Triune, Enterprise, Silver Chief, Revenge and Kamloops (Lots 5681-5683, 5685, 4952) were crown-granted to A. Ferguson in 1905.		
DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT	The property was reopened in 1916 by R.H. Batty who apparently represented Minnesota interests. The Triune Gold and Silver Mining and Manufacturing Company, Limited was incorporated in June 1918. Exploration and development work was carried on until the fall of 1918. The workings to this date consisted of some 1,800 feet of drifts on 4 levels, and 180 feet of raise. The property became involved in an estate and litigation over title prevented further operations. From 1900 to 1918, 653 tons of ore were shipped from this property. From this ore 335 ounces of gold, 144,928 ounces of silver, 494,867 pounds of lead, and 9,749 pounds of zinc were recovered.
