REMARKS

The "American" was acquired in 1901 by the "Mountain Lion Mining & Development Co.Ltd.," which has driven a cross-cut tunnel 55 ft. intersecting the vein at a depth of 35 ft. from the surface; a drift was then continued on the vein for a distance of 185 ft. The above work has proven a vein 1 to 3 ft. wide carrying galena & carbonates. The value of this ore is about \$100 per ton but no shipments have been made,

A crosscut tunnel of 605 ft is now being driven to top of the vein at depth of 800 ft.

About 1,500 ft. of development was done during the year and 15 tons of ore shipped.
