DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The country rocks, as indicated on Map 235 A, belong to the Lardeau series of late Precambrian age. The Barclay vein consists of galena sparingly disseminated in quartz at the east end of a road cut in altered greenstone. Strike and dip cannot be measured accurately in this small exposure, and consequently the failure of drilling in 1954 and 1956 to find mineralization is not necessarily conclusive.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The Barclay vein is located on the south side of Pool Creek approximately 1½ miles southeast of Camborne and 30 miles southeast of Revelstoke. The vein is about 1,000 feet west of the Spider mine (82 K/13, AG 2).

Sunshine Lardeau Mines, Limited carried out 443 feet of diamond drilling in 4 holes in the vicinity of the Barclay vein in 1954.
