DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT The country rocks are mainly black, carbonaceous slates and thin, interbedded quartzites and argillites of the Slocan series. They are folded and faulted and are penetrated by numerous dykes and sills of quartz porphyry and one small gran- ite stock. The workings have explored a zone of fracture and shearing striking westerly. In this zone are quartz veins and lenses varying from an inch to over a foot in thickness and mostly rather flat lying.
