DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The country rocks consist of quartzites, argillites and limestones of the Slocan series. The average strike is N65°W and the average dip is 57°SW. A comparatively large, somewhat elliptical quartz diorite stock outcrops just to the north and occupies a control position in the underground workings. The lode system has a general strike of N40°E. The dip is south-east at from 50 to 80°. A series of mineralized fissures, possibly of the nature of cross-fissures, strike about N80°E and good ore occurred in the vicinity of the points of intersection with the main lode. Three main ore shoots, called the "main", "north" and "south", were found within a horizontal distance of about 2,000 feet. The ore consists of galena, sphalerite, pyrite, chalcocite, ruby and native silver, and a little chalcopyrite in a gangue composed principally of quartz.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located in the basin of McGuigan creek, a northwesterly flowing tributary of Seaton creek. It was first operated by the Rambler-Cariboo Consolidated Gold and Silver Mining Co. In 1899 it was taken over by Rambler-Cariboo Mines Ltd. Prior to 1904 development was confined to the upper eight levels, the lower five of which were connected with each other and with No. 3 adit level by a shaft 460 feet deep. A crosscut 4,500 feet long was driven from the valley of McGuigan creek 520 feet below No. 8 level. This level, No. 14, was subsequently connected by a raise with No. 8 level, and Nos. 9, 10 and 12 intermediate levels run above it. In 1921 the company suspended operations.

During the following years the property was worked intermittently by leasers. In 1947 the property was acquired by B.C. Slocan-Rambler Mines (1947) Ltd. and about 4,500 feet of diamond drilling completed.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION/HISTORIQUE DE LA PRODUCTION

From 1895 to 1951, 208,801 tons of ore were shipped from this property. From this ore, 27 ounces of gold, 3,503,197 ounces of silver, 720 pounds of copper, 23,651,029 pounds of lead, 5,857,039 pounds of zinc, and 6,077 pounds of cadmium were recovered.
