The country rocks are slates, argillites, limestones and quartzites of the Slocan series. They have been folded and intruded with dykes. Dips are variable to the southwest, going as high as 80° on the Lucky Boy claim. Galena and sphalerite occur in cross fissures in the limestone.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This group of claims is located on Kaslo Creek near the community of Blaylook, which is about 14 miles from the town of Kaslo.

Owner of the property in 1935 was Mr. C. Lind of Kaslo. Development work at this time consisted of a number of trenches and an adit 75 feet long at a depth of 40 feet. At about 35 feet from the portal a drift was driven to the contact of the limestone with the thin bedded argillaceous sediments.

Wayside Consolidated Gold Mines Ltd. held an option on the property in 1937 and completed about 50 feet of drift. The Lucky Boy Mining Syndicate of Vancouver was formed in 1943 to develop the Lucky Boy, Roosevelt and No More claims. At this time the property was developed on two levels, the upper adit about 80 feet long, the lower one about 150 feet long. A few shallow shafts were sunk from the lower level.

Mr. C. Lind of Kaslo acquired the Lucky Boy Group of claims in 1948. This group consisted of the Lucky Boy, Fourth of July and Jocker claims, all held by right of assessment. Leasers worked on the property intermittently during the next two years. Diamond drilling, amounting to 300 feet in 3 holes, failed to give any conclusive results and the property was abandoned.
