DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The formation consists of crystalline limestone, carbonaceous slates, mica schists, and greenstones. The beds strike northeast and dip about 15 degrees southeast. The upper adit follows a 5 foot band of grey limestone intercalated with carbonaceous and micaceous schists. The limestone has been replaced along the bedding by a small amount of quartz, pyrite, pyrrhotite, sphalerite, galena, and chalcopyrite. A fissure strikes northeast and dips 76 degrees southeast in the upper adit; it is poorly mineralized with quartz, calcite, and a little pyrite and sphalerite. No ore was visible in the lower adit.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property lies at about the 7,000 foot elevation at the headwaters of Keystone creek. The claims were staked in 1896 and some development work was done at that time. A.W. McIntosh did some development work on the property on several occasions between 1905 and 1929.

The showing is developed by two adits, the one 25 feet vertically above the other. The upper adit was driven 40 feet, the lower one 100 feet; a raise connects the two adits.
