DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The country rocks consist of schists, quartzites, grits and small amounts of limestone of the Proterozoic Horsethief Creek Group. The Ellen D adit was driven on a 6 foot wide quartz vein containing a seam of iron sulphides averaging 2 inches in width which carries values in gold. The Buckskin adit crosscuts a number of quartz stringers which are similarly mineralized.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the southeasterly side of Beverly Peak, on a southeasterly flowing tributary of Bobbie Burns Creek some 20 miles south-southwest of Golden. The claims lie at elevations of 7,000 to 8,000 feet in what was known locally as "Cariboo Basin".

Details of history are lacking. The first report of activity was in 1890. By 1892 some 350 feet of adits had been driven at various locations in the basin. The Ellen D (Lot 1114) and Buckskin (Lot 1115) claims were Crown-granted in 1898 to L.B. Keyser and J.C.H. Joliffe. The workings at that time included a 65 foot adit on the Ellen D and a 50 foot crosscut adit on the Buckskin.
