DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The property is underlain by rocks of the Proterozoic Horse-thief Creek Group. On the property these rocks comprise slates, schists, and some limestone, having a northwesterly strike and dip of 55 degrees. The lower showing is a well defined quartz vein which is locally mineralized with iron pyrites and chalcopyrite. For a short distance above the adit the vein consists of intercalated bands of quartz and schist stained with copper over a width of 16 feet. In the upper showing, which contains similar mineralization, the vein is locally well mineralized above the adit over a width of 12 inches. The enclosing rocks are stained with oxides of iron for a considerable width. Some 200 feet along the ridge from the portal of the adit all trace of the vein is lost.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the north side of Bobbie Burns Creek some 18 miles south-southwest of Golden. Location data is sparse. The lower claims were reportedly located at the 6,200 foot elevation, 1,200 feet above what was known locally as "Spruce Tree Camp" on Bobbie Burns creek. The upper showing, located on top of a narrow ridge at the 7,800 foot elevation, was staked as the Rainbow claim.

No record has been found of the initial work on these showings, although a 120 foot drift adit was driven at the 6,200 foot elevation and a 100 foot drift adit at the 7,800 foot elevation.

A group of 6 claims was owned by C.J. Lincke, of Golden during the period 1917-1919. He organized Tarheel Copper Company, Limited, which was incorporated in July 1917. Underground work reported in 1917 is not separable from earlier work on the property. The company charter was surrendered in 1922.
