HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT  
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

These 2 adjoining claims are located south of the Canadian Pacific Railway, about 1 mile east of Illecillewaet. Little information on the property has been published.

In 1898 the Laurier claim, at that time owned by A. Chilberg, had a tunnel driven 125 feet of a planned 200-foot length.

In 1900 both the Laurier and Silver Bell were owned by O.R. Dahl and associates. At that time it was reported that in addition to the tunnel, the vein had been crosscut in many places.

In 1915 the Silver Bell and the adjoining Laurel (Laurier?) claims were Crown-granted to O.R. Dahl and associates.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION/HISTORIQUE DE LA PRODUCTION

In 1901 a trial shipment of ore was made from the Silver Bell claim. The only other production noted was in 1941 when 4 tons of ore were shipped from the same claim. From this last shipment 171 oz of silver, 2,932 lbs of lead, and 500 lbs of zinc were recovered.
