Near the 8,000' elevation, east-west striking pegmatite dykes from 4 to 10 feet wide dip almost vertical. The lower dyke, having a width of about 4.5 feet, shows a few scattered crystals of cassiterite and a little light-coloured mica.

The showings are reported to be on "Crystal" creek, a tributary of McDougal Creek, some 20 miles east of Revelstoke.

Six claims were staked in about 1912 by Cranbrook interests following the discovery by a prospector of cassiterite in pegmatite float. No work was done on the showings.
