DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The claims are underlain by Lower Jurassic Bonanza volcanics of the Vancouver Group. Locally these are intruded by dykes and irregular masses of fine diorite of the Island intrusions.

A vein from 0 to 2" wide strikes southwesterly and dips steeply northwest, following a shear 2 to 8" wide. The vein matter consists of quartz, calcite and minor pyrite. Assays over widths of from 1 to 3" ranged from 0.3 to 1.2 oz/t gold and a trace to 0.6 oz/t silver.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located on the west side of Zeballos River 1 km north of Zeballos.

The Answer 1-6 claims (Lots 482-485, 499 respectively) were staked in 1937 by H.A. Heywood and associates. Two adits totalling about 200' were driven at that time. The claims were Crown-granted in 1939.

Zeballos Answer Gold Mines, Limited was incorporated in April 1939 to acquire the property. The lower adit was extended 30'. The company charter was surrendered in 1943.
