It probably includes Crown-grant Lots 311, 312, 31 and 328, as shown on NTS Map 92 F/4, east half. The Crow Group, owned by Messrs. Drinkwater and Jensen, wa located in 1898. It consisted of the Crow, Lady S, Two Sisters Star and Latchbrook Mineral claims, the last two being Crown- grants. In 1898 the Crow claim was surveyed and a 65-foot adit with a 17-foot open-cut approach was driven on the Two Sisters claim. The group was prospected to some extent annually by the locators until 1916 when it was bonded to Sam Silverman of Seattle and the Tofino Copper Company of New York, a subsidiary of ABC Metals Company (neither of these companies were regis- tered in Canada). A second adit was driven 30 feet with a 25- foot open-cut approach. Work was suspended in 1916 and the Sta and Latchbrook claims were reverted to the Crown. About sixty

These rocks are intruded by scattered diorite bodies which are generally sill- like in form. Small lenses of limestone are scattered in the valley flat. The intrusive complex is irregularly altered to or veined by garnet-epidote-amphibolite-calcite skarn. The limestone is little altered. At the Crow showings most of the orebodies consist of bands of magnetite up to six feet wide which occur near the contact		recorded claims in three blocks. The principal block of 34 claims and fractions lies along the lower courses of Tofino an Onad Creeks. It includes the Lida, Foremost, Foremost Copper, Canyon, Clear Creek, Velvet and Copper Creek groups. The othe blocks comprise the Tofino Group (Cu 6) and Tofino Nickel Grou (Ni 1).
