DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

A fine-grained acid porphyry dyke here is mineralized by pyrite and chalcopyrite. Some mineralization is found also in reddish limestone along its contact with the dyke.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The Bulliondale group of 6 claims was staked prior to 1913, and the claims were Crown-granted in 1918.

On the Lady of the Lake claim an adit 100 feet in length crosscuts 3 zones of low-grade copper mineralization. The first zone is exposed near the portal of the adit. The second, exposed about 60 feet in from the portal, and has a width of about 10 feet, and has been drifted on for a short distance. A sample taken across 3 feet at the face assayed: gold, trace; silver, trace; copper, 0.5%. A third zone, also low in grade, is exposed near the face of the adit.
