"In 1952 a gold showing was discovered at sea-level on the northwestern shore of Sechelt Peninsula, near the northern end of Agamemnon Channel. Two pits, 4 feet and 6 feet deep, were excavated on weak northeasterly trending fractures in batholithic rock. The fractures contain quartz and in places abundant pyrite. A sample of pyritic material gave the following assay: Gold, 6.21 oz per ton; silver, 6.4 oz per ton.

"This showing is of no economic importance". (Bacon, 1957, p. 39).
