## DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

Olivine Mountain is underlain by a Triassic intrusive complex of dunite, pyroxenite and gabbro, characterized by a concentric or zonal arrangement of rock units. On the northerly slopes of the mountain a north-striking set of shear zones contain quartz veins as groups of quartz stringers mineralized with pyrite, chalcopyrite, galena and sphalerite. Samples from the Sootheran claims assayed a trace of gold and a fraction of an ounce in silver. Showings on the Copper Queen claim were reported to be pyrite and chalcopyrite as apparent disseminations in small areas in pyroxenite.

# HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The showings are located on the south side of the Tulameen River about  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile downstream from the junction with Britton (Eagle) Creek, some 16 miles west-northwest of Princeton.

Showings in this vicinity were worked in 1913 or earlier by W. Britton, of Tulameen. In 1918 the Quartz and Copper Queen 1 and 2 claims were owned by Andy Jensen, of Tulameen; trenching was reported. Mr. Britton did further work in this vicinity in 1926 on a new discovery of quartz containing free gold.

Garnet Sootheran, of Tulameen, owned two claims in this vicinity in the 1930's; trenching was reported.
