DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT (DESCRIPTION DI GISEMENT COVE COPPER ACCORDING TO RICE (1947, P. 73): The Aspen Grove copper camp covers an area some 8 miles long extending northerly from a couple of miles north of Misseula Lake to the boundary of Princeton Map-area. The camp lies roughly parallel with the main Princeton-Merritt highway and extends east from it for a width of from 2 to $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles. The mineral deposits consist of chalcopyrite, bornite, chalcocite and some pyrite and hematite in shear zones in volcanic rocks of the Nicola group. None of these shear zones is large and the better deposits are restricted to small shoots within them ... The ore minerals also occur as grains disseminated more or less at random through the lava in the interstices between the fragments of flow breccia. This type of mineralization is widespread but has not been found to be sufficiently high grade to be econmically interesting". On the Copper Star claim a brecciated zone in angite andesite porphyry is mineralized with chalcopyrite, chalcocite, secondary copper carbonates and a little native copper. The mineralized zone has been exposed over widths up to 30 feet and is of undetermined length.
