DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The formation consists of volcanics of the Nicola group which at about the 3,300 foot elevation became covered by tertiary volcanics. In the vicinity of the mineralization the Nicola rocks consist mainly of latites which contain a large number of pegmatitic veinlets and masses which are irregular in form and have poorly defined boundaries. Two mineralized areas have been exposed, the larger near the railway and the smaller at the upper limits of the Duke of York claim just under the tertiary volcanics. The ore consists of blebs of chalcopyrite and pyrite disseminated through the latite and usually but not always closely associated with the pegmatite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This property, located about a mile north of Copper Mountain, extends from the Similkameen River eastward to about the 3,500 foot elevation. The claims were Crown-granted to Mary Agnes Voigt in 1906. Exploration work on the Duke of York consisted of about 400 feet of trenching and a crosscut adit 110 ft. long. Work on the Number 15 Fraction, which adjoins to the east, consists of an adit 40 feet long.

The claims, as part of the Voigt group, were prospected by the South Yale Copper Company, the British Columbia Copper Company Limited, and in about 1930 by the Consolidated Mining & Smelting Company of Canada Limited.

Cumont Mines Limited, incorporated in March 1965, acquired the Voigt property and a number of other claims surrounding the Copper Mountain property on three sides. During 1965 geochemical and magnetometer surveys were carried out and several anomalies outlined. During 1966 bulldozer trenching was done on the Duke of York and Alabama (Lot 2429) claims and on Mineral Lease No. 39. Surface diamond drilling amounted to 8,106 feet in 16 holes.
