The showings lie in the western part of the Copper
Mountain stock. The workings are all in the intrusion, from
1,000 to 2,000 feet from the contact. The host rock is the
normal gabbro phase of the stock, with occasional fine veinlets
of pegmatitic material. Scattered irregularly through the
gabbro are small areas in which bornite, chalcopyrite, and
chalcocite are disseminated or spread out in thin films along
minute fractures. Specimens of ore found on the dumps,
judged by the large amount of bornite visible, would carry
more than 2% copper.

This property is located about $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-southwest of Princeton and some 3,000 feet south of the Ingersoll Belle group. The property extends westerly from the Similkameen River to about the 4,000 foot elevation.

McRae Bros. & associates held the 11 claim group from about 1908 until about 1916; most of the early development work was apparently done during this period. In the 1920's the property was reportedly owned by John McKay & associates of Oshkosh, Wisconsin. Development work on the Hamilton and Fraser Fraction claims consisted of 3 shafts. Down in the canyon of the Similkameen two adits were driven on the Fraser claim and one immediately below it on the Copper Cliff claim.
