## DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

This property is situated near the western contact of the Osprey Lake granodiorite body with Nicola volcanic and sedimentary rocks. These rocks are also cut by granitic and pegmatitic dykes which are probably offshoots of the batholith. Chalcopyrite and pyrite occur in a gangue of quartz and epidote in and near the pegmatite.

## HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The Lucky Strike Group of eight claims is located about five miles northeast of Princeton close to the Kettle Valley Railway near Jura. In 1928, it was owned by G. Broderick and Sons and T. Hume. There were three adits, 75, 35 and 25 feet, a 10-foot shaft and open cuts on the property.

This property might also be the prospect owned by S. Bonacci in 1942 on which two adits had been driven. The lower adit was 400 feet long and the upper one was 75 feet long.
