DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

On this property, a fault zone cuts granodiorite of Cretaceous age. Along this zone is a stock-work of quartz veinlets, sparsely mineralized with stibnite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located at an elevation of about 7,500 feet on the western edge of Antimony Mountain about 15 miles from Lytton. In 1914, five claims were located by the Keefers Indians. During the following year, W.S. Clarke acquired a half-interest in the claims and made a small shipment to Seattle. In 1916, the properties were bonded to The Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company of Canada, Limited. However, the option was allowed to lapse without any work by the company.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION

During 1915, three tons of ore were shipped to Seattle. This yielded \$92.50 in antimony.
