DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

These claims are underlain by rocks of the Bridge River Series which are intruded by the Bendor Batholith to the south. Gold and silver mineralization occur in a vein formed along well-defined fracture plains in greenstone which is in part schistose and shattered. The vein strikes north 15° east, dips 45° to 55° west and has been traced 672 feet by shallow cuts. Assays range from 0.02 to 0.36 ounces of gold per ton and 0.4 to 8.8 ounces of silver per ton.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located on the west side of Tommy Creek four miles south of its confluence with the Bridge River, about ten miles east of Gold Bridge. The workings are situated between 4,650 and 4,750 feet elevation.

In 1935 the 6 claim property was held by Benboe Deep Mines Syndicate which did intermittent work for a number of years. In July 1940, the Augustus, Peabody, Cornwall, Lancaster, Benboe and Roxborough claims (Lots 7291 to 7296) were Crown-granted to Charles W. St. John.
