DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

These claims are underlain by the Fergusson and Noel Series, consisting of sedimentary rock intercalated with minor greenstone and intruded by various dykes. Towards the northwest of the Short O'Bacon Group are greenstones and diorite related to the Bralorne intrusives and serpentinite. Minor sulphide mineralization is found in irregular lenses and veins in quartz. Muck samples taken by Pinebrayle Gold Mines, Limited, assayed 0.64 and 0.68 oz./ton of silver and traces of gold.

Associated minerals or products of value - Silver.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

These claims are situated at about 4,000 feet elevation in the valley of Cadwallader Creek, southwest of the Bralorne Mine.

In May 1933, Native Son Mines, Limited, was incorporated to acquire the Native Son group of nine claims and the Native Son Extension group of six claims. In June of the same year, Bridge River Ogden Mines, Limited, was incorporated to acquire the Ogden Fractions Nos. 1 to 4 (formerly the Roxey and Chesterfield Groups) and the Short O'Bacon group of eight claims. Over six-hundred feet of underground work was done on the Native Son property and two-hundred feet of underground work was done on the Short O'Bacon property before these two companies amalgamated to form the Bridge River Ogden (1934), Limited, in April 1934. No appreciable work was done on the property by this company.

In April 1945, Pinebrayle Gold Mines, Limited, was incorporated to acquire forty-seven claims, ten of which were Crown-granted. These claims included the Native Son property and probably other claims formerly held by Bridge River Ogden (1934), Limited. This company did general surface prospecting, drove a short adit and drilled two holes, one of which was on the boundary of the Gull-Wihksne property (see 92 J/15, Au 14) and jointly financed by the owners. The company dissolved in 1951.
