DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

These claims are underlain by metamorphosed sediments of the Bridge River series. Three parallel quartz veins located in a shear mineralized with stibnite carry gold values associated with arsenopyrite. Assays taken by Hurley River Mines Ltd. ran 0.14 to 1.80 oz./ton Au; 1.10 oz./ton Ag; and 34.25% Sb.

Associated minerals or products of value - Silver, antimony.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property consists of twenty claims in the upper part of Truax Creek at an elevation of 6,000 feet, about five miles northeast of Bralorne.

In June 1959, Hurley River Mines Ltd. located fifteen claims, known as the Spruce Group. The following year, they did surface stripping and diamond drilling.

In May 1970, the property was acquired by Dawson Range Mines Ltd. and was known as the Truax Group of twenty claims (record numbers 32998 to 33017). Work consisted of trenching, stripping and two X-ray drill holes.
