DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

This property is underlain by sedimentary and volcanic rocks of the Hurley Formation which contain some granitic intrusives immediately to the east of the Lake. The showings include a lode heavily mineralized with stibnite two-thirds of a mile south of Gwyneth Lake and a number of quartz veins, the most promising of which is three-quarters of a mile southwest of the Lake.

Associated minerals or products of value - Gold.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is situated on either side of Gwyneth Lake, and extend for 1 $\frac{3}{4}$  miles southwest of the Lake, five miles southwest of Gold Bridge.

In 1959 the property consisted of 56 claims owned by Hurley River Mines Ltd. (name changed to New Cinch Uranium Ltd. in 1968) which was incorporated in February of that year. Work by the company included bulldozer stripping, hand trenching and 200 feet of packsack drilling. Rayrock Mines Limited optioned the group in 1960, drilling six holes for a total of 1,800 feet before dropping the option. In 1964 the owners uncovered a vein containing copper and gold values by stripping and trenching. Some soil samples were taken.

This ground was later covered by the Luc Nos. 1-20, Stibnite Nos. 1-4 and Lost Gold Nos. 1-2 claims. The Stibnite claims, situated 4,000 feet south of the Lake at 3,000 feet elevation, were owned by Thunder Creek Mines Ltd. in 1970; trenching was reported.
