## DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The claims are underlain in part by fine grained basalt considered as belonging to the Upper Triassic Karmutsen group. Locally these rocks contain abundant amygdules of quartz, epidote and occasionally calcite. Epidote amygdules frequently contained plebs of chalcopyrite. A 2 to 3 inch wide stringer, well mineralized with chalcopyrite and chalcocite was found on the Ellen #15 plaim. An intrusive body occurs in the eastern section of the plaim group.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located on the west side of the Salmon River about 10 miles south-southeast of Sayward.

Road building for logging operations uncovered copper mineralization. The Ellen 1-40 and Dot 1-30 claims were staked by W.R. Boyes, of Sayward, in 1969. The Lem 1-20 claims were staked by Boyes on behalf of Messrs. Schnell and Greg, principals of Jetex Resources Ltd. The company purchased the 90 claim property in 1969 and carried out geological, geochemical and magnetometer surveys.
