DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Disseminated pyrite occurs in locally silicified and fragmental andesites of the Lower Jurassic Bonanza Formation. The andesites are cut by quartz porphyry dykes.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located approximately 10 miles southsoutheast of Port Hardy, immediately east of the head of Rupert Inlet. It adjoins the Island Copper mine production leases. (See 92 L/11, CU 1).

In 1974, Utah Mines Ltd. held the Rupert 1 to 30 claims. Surface diamond drilling of five BQ holes totalling 2,914 feet was carried out on Rupert 23, 25 and 28.
