# HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the south shore of Rupert Inlet west of Keekuyzed Creek.

The Rupert claim was staked in 1908 by Mr. C. Nordström of Quatsino.

In 1910 the property was bonded by the Canadian American Exploration Company. Work done included open cuts, and a shaft and adit totalling 400 feet.

Hardy Minerals Ltd. held the Dem group of 54 claims in 1968. In 1969, work carried out by Pathfinder Uranium & Nickel Mines Ltd., on the Dem 1 to 14 and 24 to 54 claims, included geological, geochemical, and magnetometer surveys. The company name was changed in 1969 to Pathfinder Resources Ltd. Diamond drilling was carried out in 1970.

#### HISTORY OF PRODUCTION

In 1908 the original stakers shipped six tons of 8 per cent copper ore.
