DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Andesite, basalt, tuff, breccia, and limestone of the Upper Triassic-Jurassic Bonanza Subgroup are intruded by granite rocks. Some of the contacts show epidote, chlorite, and Kfeldspar alteration.

Faulting is extensive. Small veins contain pyrite, pyrrhotite, chalcopyrite, sphalerite, and galena.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located between 1,000 and 2,000 feet elevation at the confluence of Rowland Creek and Kaouk River, 52 miles east of Fair Harbour, Kyuquot Sound.

In 1972 the Tony 1 to 38, and Ka 1 to 48 claims were owned by Noranda Exploration Company, Limited. Surface geological mapping, 1 inch equals 1,000 feet, was carried out over Tony 1-10, 24-28, 30-32 and Ka 25-28. A geochemical soil survey of 283 samples was carried out over Tony 1-5, 7, 9, 23-25, 30.
