## DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The main showing is a very narrow fissure (a quarter inch wide) in Jurassic granodiorite, showing some sulphides.

A sample taken across 6 inches of sheared material showing some sulphides assayed: gold, 0.04 ounces per ton, and silver, trace.

## HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at an elevation of 1,500 feet about 2 miles southeast of Amai Inlet, Kyuquot Sound. The Fil group (92 L/3, AU 1) adjoins to the west.

Discovered in the early 1940's or late 1930's, the property consisted of 6 recorded claims owned by J.J. Pugh and associates.

In 1941 a sample test lot of 0.1075 dry tons gave the following values: 4.145 ounces of gold per ton, 0.20 ounce of silver per ton, 0.60 per cent lead, 17.80 per cent iron, 5.00 per cent sulphur, and 40.40 per cent silica.

During 1946 and 1947 surface stripping and trenching was done.
