## **DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT**

**TRUDULI** 

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The area is underlain chiefly by sedimentary and volcanic rocks of the Bonanza Subgroup of Lower Jurassic age. Mineralization is associated with quartz veining in both volcanic and sedimentary rocks. It also occurs as minor disseminations and veinlets of chalcopyrite.

### HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at an elevation of 1,200 feet on the east side of the Malksope River, 2 miles west of Kashutl Inlet.

The 35 KYU claims were owned by the Kyuquot Syndicate (Newmont Mining Corporation of Canada Limited and Bralorne-Canfer Resources Limited) in 1969. The KYU 44 to 58 claims were mapped geologically and a regional stream sediment survey was made. An area of 900 square feet was stripped of overburden and six trenches totalling 160 feet were cut in bedrock. An adit was driven 12 feet, and four holes totalling 261 feet were diamond drilled.
