DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The area is underlain chiefly by sedimentary and volcanic rocks of the Bonanza Subgroup of Lower Jurassic age. Mineralization is associated with quartz veining in both volcanic and sedimentary rocks. It also occurs as minor disseminations and veinlets of chalcopyrite.

The Easy claims cover a zone of widespread but minor chalcopyrite and pyrite mineralization.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at an elevation of 500 feet at the head of Malksope River.

The Easy group of 40 claims was part of a 54 claim property held by Falconbridge Nickel Mines Limited in 1971. Reconnaissance silt sampling and detailed soil sampling were carried out in 1970. A total of 1,700 silt and 220 soil samples were collected for analysis.
