DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The claims are underlain by Lower Jurassic Bonanza pyroclastics and andesite flows. The claims are separated from the Brooks granodiorite-diorite by a northwest trending fault.

On Fang 1 and 2 claims the volcanic rocks are intensively fractured and silicified and contain 1 to 2 per cent finely disseminated pyrite. Chalcopyrite and pyrite occur in fractures striking 300 to 325 degrees.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located about 7 miles southwest of Port Alice, near the headwaters of the Klaskish River at approximately 1,500 feet elevation.

The Fang 1 to 9 and 11 to 14 claims and Fang 10 Fraction were held by Imperial Oil Limited in 1974. Work done included surface geological and topographical mapping. Linecutting and a magnetometer and IP survey were carried out on Fang 1-4, 8, and 9 claims. A BQ hole was diamond drilled a total of 506 feet on Fang 1.
