A well defined lead, about 4 feet wide, carrying copper, gold and some silver occurs near a contact between Upper Triassic Parson Bay sediments and Lower Jurassic Bonanza volcanics.

Associated minerals or products of value - Gold, silver.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showing is located on the west side of Nerontsos Inlet, Quatsino Sound, adjoining the Yaeka property to the north. (See 92 L/5, CU 1).

In 1906, Evenson, Sorenson, Lakker, Bergh and Sherberg held the Climax claim and H.S. Butler held the Uncle Sam claim. The showing was exposed by open cuts and stripping.
