DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The area is underlain by Upper Triassic sediments of the Parson Bay Formation and Lower Jurassic Bonanza volcanics.

Sphalerite and galena occur sparsely along Edison Creek in skarn beds from 4 to 6 inches thick, striking north 75 degrees west and dipping 70 degrees northward. These beds are interbedded with a greenish fine-grained limestone which shows no mineralization. This is the only occurrence of these minerals known on the property.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showing occurs along Edison Creek at about 500 feet above Neroutsos Inlet. The Tuscaroca claim is part of the Yreka Group owned by Yreka Copper Company in the early 1950's. (See 92 L/5, CU 1).

In 1953 the property was under option to Noranda Exploration Company Limited.
