DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The property is underlain by Upper Triassic Quatsino limestone and Lower Jurassic Bonanza volcanics and intruded by a diorite stock.

Weak mineralization is disseminated along the limestone-tuff contact. The tuff wedges out downward between limestone and diorite.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT 92 L/6 FE 12
The showing is located at an elevation of 1,900 feet on the Merry Widow Creek about 2 miles west of the Benson River. The Eagle group was owned by Quatsino Copper-Gold Mines, Limited, which was incorporated April 1928 to acquire the Merry Widow and Independent groups (see 92 L/6, Fe 1).
