DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Mineralization occurs at a contact between Triassic Quatsino limestone and Jurassic Bonanza volcanics. The area is intruded by greenstone and to the west a diorite gabbro stock.

The mineralized zone is 400 feet long and 100 feet wide with scattered magnetite skarns.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT 92 L/6 FE 3

The property is located at an elevation of 2,600 feet about one mile west of the Benson River. The Marten showing is located on the southwest corner of the Merry Widow No. 5 claim.

In July 1913, the Wolfle Bros. of Spokane, Wash., bonded a group of twenty claims, which included the Merry Widow No. 5 claim.

The Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company of Canada Limited assumed control of the property and organized the Coast Copper Company, Limited, in Sept. 1916. (See 92 L/6, Cu 1).

On May 28, 1919, the Merry Widow No. 5 claim (Lot 1533) was Crown-granted to W.J. Vaughan.

The property was acquired by Quatsino Copper-Gold Mines Limited in 1928. (See 92 L/6, Fe 1).

By 1956 the showings were developed by Empire Development Company, Limited.
