Magnetite skarn occurs in greenstone at the contact between Triassic Quatsino limestone on the east and a diorite-gabbro stock on the west.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showing is located at an elevation of 2,400 feet, one mile west of the Benson River. The Whiskey Jack showing is located in the center of the Merry Widow No. 1 claim.

The Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company of Canada Limited resumed control of the property and organized the Coast Copper Company, Limited, in Sept. 1916. (See 92 L/6, Cu 1).

The Merry Widow No. 1 claim (Lot 1529) was Crown-granted in 1918 to A. Goyes.

The property was acquired by Quatsino Copper-Gold Mines Limited in 1928. (See 92 L/6, Fe 1).

In 1956 the showings were developed by Empire Development Company, Limited.
