DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The area is underlain by Triassic Quatsino limestone and intrusive andesite.

Mineralization includes an irregular vein-like body of magnetite in limestone and skarn.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT ^{92 L/6 FE 5}
 The showing is located at an elevation of 1,900 feet, about one mile west of the Benson River.
 The Rambler Fraction (Lot 1537) was Crown-granted in 1922 to Messrs. Keeling, Vaughan, and Gray.
 The property was owned by Quatsino Copper-Gold Mines, Limited, in 1928. In 1956 Empire Development Company, Limited (40% owned by Quatsino), developed the area. The Rambler showing was traversed by the 1,900 foot level adit leading to the Kingfisher and Merry Widow zones. (See 92 L/6, FE 1).
